WARRANT TO CALL MAINE SCHOOL ADMINISTRATIVE DISTRICT NO. 8 BUDGET MEETING (20-A M.R.S. § 1485)

TO: Tina Davidson a resident of Maine School Administrative District No. 8 (the "District") composed of the Town of Vinalhaven, State of Maine.

ARTICLE 12: To see what sum the District will appropriate for the total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12 as described in the Essential Programs and Services Funding Act and to see what sum the District will raise and assess as the municipality's contribution to the total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12 as described in the Essential Programs and Services Funding Act in accordance with the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, section 15688.

Town of Vinalhaven: **\$2,443,582.85**

Total Raised and Assessed:

Town of Vinalhaven: **\$1,850,772.18**

Explanation: The District's contribution to the total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12 as described in the Essential Programs and Services Funding Act is the amount of money determined by state law to be the minimum amount that the District must raise and assess in order to receive the full amount of state dollars.

ARTICLE 13: To see what sum the District will raise and appropriate for the annual payments on debt service previously approved by the District voters for non-state-funded school construction projects or non-state-funded portions of school construction projects in addition to the funds appropriated as the local share of the District's contribution to the total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12.

School Board Recommends \$88,727.26

NOTE: The Recommended Amount includes \$60,575.74 for Region 8 debt service.

Explanation: Non-state-funded debt service is the amount of money needed for the annual payments on the District's long-term debt for major capital school construction projects that are not approved for state subsidy. The bonding of this long-term debt was previously approved by the District voters.

ARTICLE 14: **(Written ballot required.)** To see what sum the District will raise and appropriate in additional local funds (**Recommend \$1,478,813.16**), which exceeds the State's Essential Programs and Services allocation model by (**Recommend \$1,478,813.16**) as required to fund the budget recommended by the School Board.

The School Board Recommends \$1,478,813.16, which exceeds the State's Essential Programs and Services allocation model by \$1,478,813.16. The School Board gives the following reasons for exceeding the State's Essential Programs and Services funding model: The EPS model under-recognizes island costs, small school costs, co-curricular and extra-curricular costs, and special education costs.

Explanation: The additional local funds are those locally raised funds over and above the District's local contribution to the total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12 as described in the Essential Programs and Services Funding Act and local amounts raised for the annual payment on non-state funded debt service that will help achieve the District budget for educational programs.

ARTICLE 15: To see what sum the District will authorize the School Board to expend for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019 and ending June 30, 2020 from the District's contribution to the total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12 as described in the Essential Programs and Services Funding Act, non-state-funded school construction projects, additional local funds for school purposes under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, section 15690, unexpended balances, tuition receipts, state subsidy and other receipts for the support of schools.
School Board Recommends \$4,211,123.27

ARTICLE 18: In addition to amounts approved in the preceding articles, shall the School Board be authorized to expend such other sums as may be received from federal or state grants or programs or other sources during the fiscal year for school and other program purposes, provided that such grants, programs or other sources do not require the expenditure of other funds not previously appropriated?

Local share from this school district is **\$2,417.50**.
