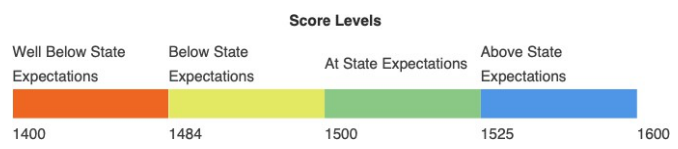
VS Preliminary MTY 24 Reading Summative Achievement Levels
